The Australian Society for Historical Archaeology was founded in 1970 to promote the study of historical archaeology in Australia. Two decades later with the formal incorporation of New Zealand archaeologists into the Society the name was changed to Australasian. The Society encourages archaeological research on historical sites, buildings, artefacts and relics by appropriate means including historical research, survey, recording, excavation and analysis and the publication of results of such research. The Society supports the conservation of sites and relics which are part of the Australian and New Zealand heritage.

The interests of the Society include historical sites, buildings and relics reflecting all aspects of life in Australia and New Zealand from European contact until the present.

The Society aims to promote the exchange of information, research and reference material relating to historical archaeology, within Australia, New Zealand and overseas. The wide range of historical archaeology in which it is interested is reflected in ASHA's publications: *Studies in Historical Archaeology*, a series of *Occasional Papers*, volumes based on the papers from the Annual Conference, the quarterly *Newsletter* and *Australasian Historical Archaeology*.

The Society's activities include public lectures and an annual conference which provides a forum for speakers from throughout Australia, New Zealand and overseas. Members of the Society receive the quarterly *Newsletter*, and *Australasian Historical Archaeology* as part of their subscription.

Membership is open to all those interested in historical archaeology at both amateur and professional levels.
